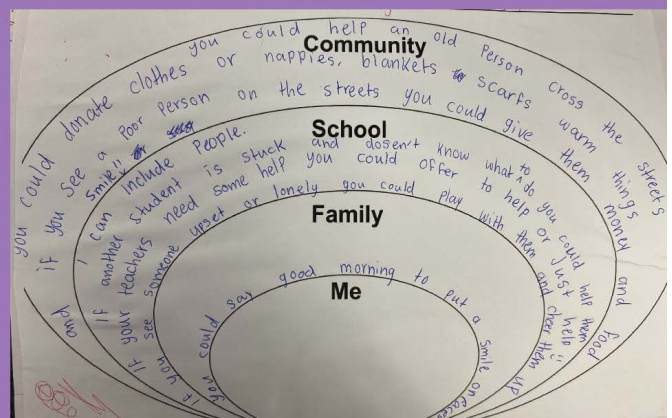
- ① The ways I can promote and act out peace and justice are: the commandments.

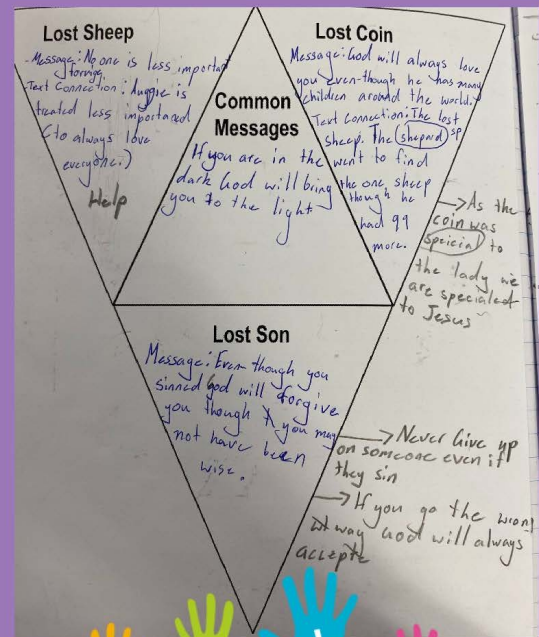

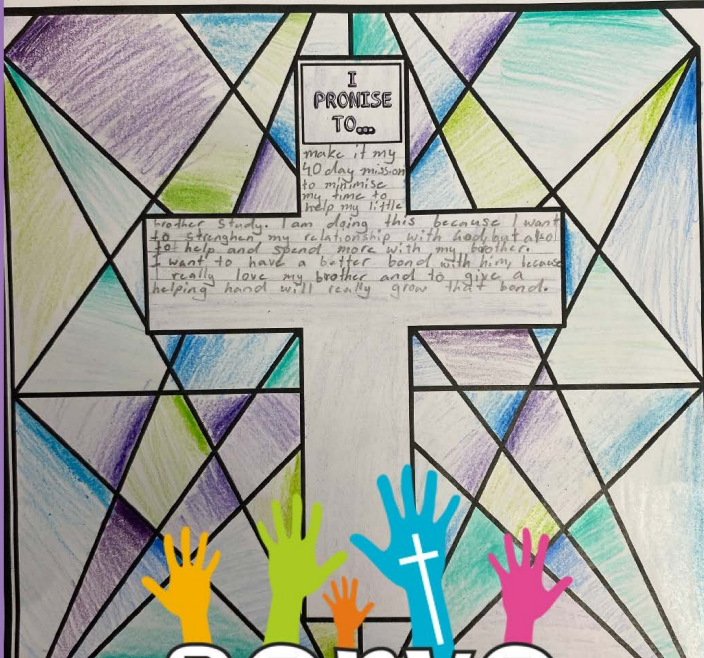

**My Lenten Prayer**

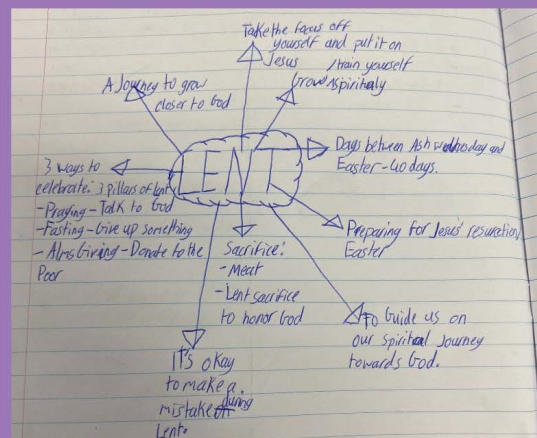
Prayer = Every night and when I need help, I can pray to God.

## Principal's Desk

Last week's excessive rainfall and strong winds have really brought to reality the importance of working as a community. The support we received from the Police and SES workers, parents and staff was just amazing. Thank you is not enough. The focus from all stakeholders centred around the safety of our children and community.

After each event, the school leadership team meets to discuss the critical incident and discern areas of improvement. One issue that I would like to raise with our community was the quantity of calls made from parents following the email that was sent to parents. The volume of calls was overwhelming, most calls requested information that had already been sent out to families in the first correspondence. I ask parents to please limit calls to our office during critical incidents. The school will always endeavour to communicate relevant information in a timely manner. I thank you for your consideration in this matter as it allows the staff to focus on their roles and responsibilities during critical incidents.

I have included the information from our last newsletter regarding the changes to processes from the 7th of March as outlined from NSW Health.

I wish to thank our parents for your continued support regarding the many regulations and processes that are currently in place as safety measures to minimise the spread of Covid 19 in our community.

In saying that, we still have many children and community members who have been affected by Covid in our school.

As you would have heard in the media, the Government has made changes to the current restrictions, some changes starting on the 28th of February. As a school we need to look at these in light of the current transmission rate in our school. The school leadership team has spent many hours discussing the best way forward to continue to protect our children and teachers so that we can limit the spread of COVID and also minimise the loss of school days for children and staff. In lieu of this the following restrictions will continue until the end of the term.

- A further 8 RATs will be given per student and staff. These will be sent home starting from the 7th of March. They can be used when your child is feeling unwell, has a sore throat or cough, or if a family member is sick. They can also be used when you know that your child has been with someone who has COVID-19. For safety, please continue to use RATs.
- For Primary schools, masks will continue to be required indoors for all school staff, volunteers and visitors including parents and carers in primary schools until Friday 4 March. From Monday 7 March, masks will no longer be mandatory for all students and staff. Any student or staff member



who wants to continue to wear a mask may do so.

- From Monday 28 February, students will no longer be required to be kept in year groups or other cohorts. We will continue to use a sensible COVID-smart approach when we plan activities and events. We will keep you updated about planning for school activities - we know that you are excited to learn about how our community will celebrate some of the events that are such an important part of school life this year.
- From Monday 28 February, parents will be able to visit the office face to face. **We will continue with Kiss and drop in the morning limiting visitors on site to ensure we can minimise the transmission of Covid. Please do not enter our school site for any other reason than to visit the office.**
  - **The afternoon dismissal process will remain the same.**

The advice from NSW Health is for students aged 5 and above to get vaccinated including boosters when eligible. Though vaccination is strongly encouraged for students, it is not compulsory.

As you would expect, we will continue to do everything we can to keep our community safe.

### **Parent Information Presentation and Meet the teacher meetings**

This week you will receive notification via the compass parent portal of the grade information slide presentation for parents. This will be located on the School Website for parents to access at your convenience. I encourage you to take the time to view this presentation as it will provide you with information regarding class expectations.

On this site you will also have access to the school booking platform to book your time to speak with your child's teacher. This is our meet and greet meeting that usually happens at this time of the year. As a safety measure, teachers will contact you via phone or zoom.

I encourage parents to make this booking as it is a time for teachers and parents to discuss goals that you would like to see happen for your child this year and also share information so that teachers are able to make informed decisions regarding your child's learning and wellbeing.

### **Catholic Schools Week**

Catholic Schools Week is an important event in our school calendar. We had planned a fun day for all our school community with our first parent function for the year included on Friday. Due to the excessive rainfall, our grounds are saturated. The picnic that has been planned will be postponed until another time in the term. Parents are invited to attend our Mass and Awards presentation.

## LIFE THREATENING ALLERGIES

Our School caters for many differences that children present, academic, emotional, social and health issues.

Throughout our school, we have children with **life threatening** allergies. This is a serious matter, one that the school must address. Therefore, we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for children who have life threatening allergies by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child each day.

Our aim is to minimize the amount of **peanut** and **all nut** products brought into the school and avoid all foods that contain **nuts**. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies. Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask that they **not** be brought to school at **any time**.

- Peanuts – including M & M peanuts
- Cashews, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts and all tree nuts
- Peanut butter
- Nutella
- Sesame seeds – remember some bread rolls have sesame seeds on them including some McDonald's hamburger buns
- Foods that contain satay e.g. Thai, Malaysian, Indonesian dishes
- Whole egg – boiled egg, curried egg
- Chocolate – blocks, biscuits and lollies - as chocolate has the highest cross contamination rate

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

If peanut or nuts are **not** on the ingredient list of a particular packaged food but the food has the statement:

**“MAY CONTAIN TRACES OF NUT.....”**

this food may be brought to school and consumed only by **non-allergic children**.

Due to safety concerns, we discourage children from sharing food. We would also appreciate parents speaking with children regarding this matter.

We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all of our children.

# School Student Travel

### School student travel information for parents and students

#### School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to [apply](#) or [update](#) their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their [local bus operator](#) to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### Terms of Use

**Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off** in line with the [Opal terms of use](#).

All students are required to comply with the [Student code of conduct](#). The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
