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Principal's Desk



The start of 2022 has seen many highs as well as many challenges.

I wish to begin by thanking our parents for your continued support especially with maintaining our COVID safe procedures. It was our intention to have reduced these processes this year, however with the escalating numbers every day of positive cases both of students, their family members and staff, the only option was to continue. The purpose of reducing parent and visitors on our school site was to minimise the possibility of spreading the virus therefore reducing the disruption to the learning of every child. In saying this, COVID positive cases are still occurring daily so to continue to minimise the spread at school we will continue with the restrictions into Term 2.

On a positive note, we will still endeavour to invite parents to some of our school events following our Covid safety plan. One of our main goals this year was to re-connect our families to school life. Our first re-connector event is scheduled today. Invitations went out to Kindergarten and Year 1 parents to attend an afternoon tea on the church site. The P&F organised a lovely afternoon tea spread for our parents. It was so exciting to see over 90 parents respond to the invitation. We will schedule other re-connector afternoon tea events next term. LIFE THREATENING ALLERGIES

Our School caters for many differences that children present, academic, emotional, social and health issues.

Throughout our school, we have children with **life threatening** allergies. This is a serious matter, one that the school must address. Therefore, we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for children who have life threatening allergies by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child each day.

Our aim is to minimize the amount of **peanut** and **all nut** products brought into the school and avoid all foods that contain **nuts**. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies. Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask that they **not** be brought to school at **any time**.

- Peanuts including M & M peanuts
- Cashews, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts and all tree nuts
- Peanut butter
- Nutella
- Sesame seeds remember some bread rolls have sesame seeds on them including some McDonald's hamburger buns
- Foods that contain satay e.g. Thai, Malaysian, Indonesian dishes
- Whole egg boiled egg, curried egg
- Chocolate blocks, biscuits and lollies as chocolate has the highest cross contamination rate

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

If peanut or nuts are **not** on the ingredient list of a particular packaged food but the food has the statement:

"MAY CONTAIN TRACES OF NUT......"

this food may be brought to school and consumed only be **non-allergic children**.

Due to safety concerns, we discourage children from sharing food. We would also appreciate parents speaking with children regarding this matter.

We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all of our children.

School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> <u>bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
