YEAR ONE

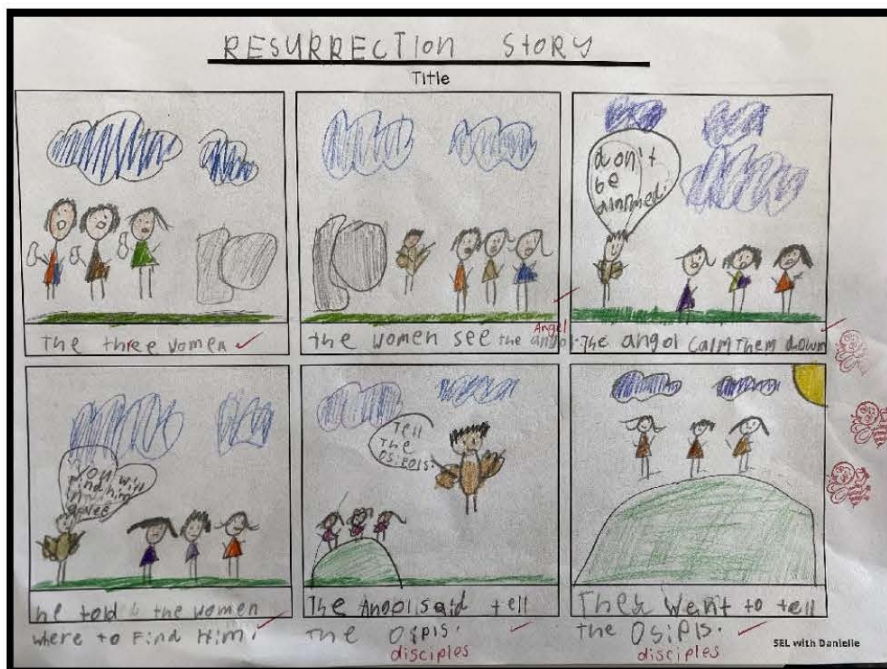


This term in Religion, Year 1 has been learning about the resurrection story as part of the unit 'Together'.

We listened to the scripture from The Resurrection of Jesus (Mark 16: 1-7). At the end of the unit the children were asked to summarise this scripture passage. When summarising, the children were encouraged to think of the most important parts of the scripture, they were asked to write in their own words and were guided to create illustrations that would help the reader understand what is happening.



During Art this term the children are using their CREATIVITY to complete mosaics, we spent two art lessons completing Mosaic Crosses. These colourful crosses are on display in classrooms.
