#### Reopening our school to our families

After such a long time coming, I feel it is as safe as it is going to be to reopen our school to our wonderful families. My thanks to you all for your support and patience as we transition back.

The gates will be open for parents as of Wednesday the 11th of October in the morning. The afternoon processes will remain with the children exiting the school grounds from the three gates at the front of the school and the back gate. This seems to be the safest way to ensure that the children are collected safely each afternoon.

In the morning the process will be as follows:

- Parents are able to enter the property with their child if needed
- Children are to follow the same school rules and wait under the COLA area until they are dismissed for playtime by a member of the school leadership team. Children then follow the teacher on morning duty to the assigned play areas.
- Parents please be mindful that teachers are very busy in the morning and will not have conversations with parents at the class door unless an appointment has been organised prior to the morning. I ask parents to please be respectful of the teachers workload prior to the school day commencing.
- Only children should go the the bag area to hang up their bags
- Just a reminder that parents are not allowed to speak with a child other than their own about issues that may arise between students. Please speak with the class teacher first and the school will handle all concerns.
- While on the grounds of the school appropriate conduct and language is expected of all adults
- Any toddlers on the grounds are the responsibility of the parent. Please keep close supervision of the little children especially around the play areas.
- All parents are asked to leave the grounds by the first bell as the school gates will be closed.

Students identified symbols, gestures, actions, words and people involved in each sacrament and shared their own understanding before discovering more about the Sacraments.


The students reflected and journaled on their own personal life and what Gift of the Holy Spirit they believed they most needed.


Joshua came 712th out of 6468 participants and Layla came 3046th out of 6468 participants.


