

Naplan reports will be sent home to parents on Tuesday July 25th.

The reports that will be sent home this year are different from previous ones. There has been a significant shift in the reporting scale descriptors to "exceeding", "strong", "developing" and "needs additional support".

I am happy to share that our school has performed above the national average in all domains in both Years 3 and 5. Congratulations students and teachers.




Faith Page Year 3

Year 3 Religion Driving Question: How and why is the love of the Holy Trinity reflected in all of creation and in God's covenant with us?



25/2 NSW all styles Karate championships -development Male Kata 8-9 years (gold medal)


11/3 NSW State championships (silver medal)
