All shoes must be appropriate for play. No high heels or thongs.

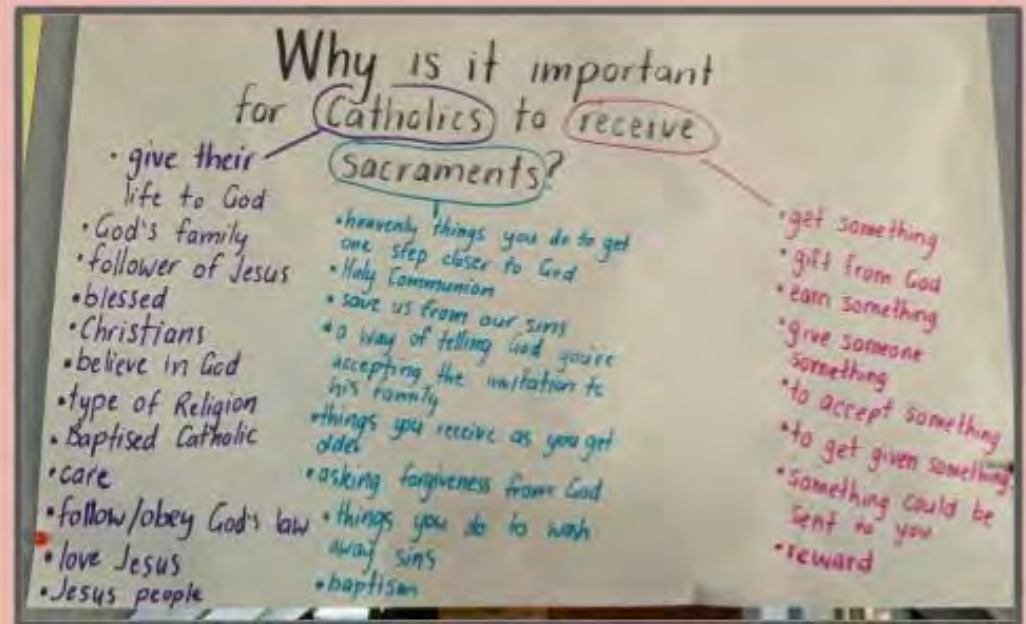


RE Driving Question:

Behind the Scenes

What's happening in our classrooms



Let's take a closer look at some of the amazing learning happening in our year 6 classes.

This term our students have been working hard growing their knowledge and skills in order to understand and create meaningful texts.

As part of this learning, we have been investigating the concept of biomes in Australia, covering some of our Literacy and Science learning outcomes in an engaging and exciting way.

How and Why are Australia's biomes unique?
 Know: Australia has a unique climate. Natural habitats on Earth. Each biome is a specific area. Different biomes have different genetic species. Biomes have different types of plants and animals. Biomes try to adapt different ways.

Want to know?
 How are they created? Why do they change the way they are? How do different animals know or learn about biomes? What kind of events can affect biomes? How do biomes change over the time due to climate change and the way animals adapt to their environment? How do biomes change over time? How do biomes change over time? Notes on The Thorny Devil
 + false head - back of neck (structural) - protection from predators
 - bows real head to present false head
 + inflate chest (behavioural) - to look bigger - scare predators
 + thorns - all over body (structural) - for protection
 + camouflage - lighter in summer (physiological) - darker in winter

THE THORNY DEVIL'S adaptations
 The Thorny Devil has a number of adaptations to help it survive in a desert biome. A false head is one of its adaptations. This is a structural adaptation. One of its structural adaptations is its distinctive thorns. From when it gets its name. These are for protection. Thorny Devils also have a false head on the back of their necks. The purpose of this is so it can scare off predators when it feels threatened. It will lower its actual head between its forelegs so that the false head is in the position of where its real head would normally be.
 A behavioural adaptation of the Thorny Devil is to inflate itself to make it appear bigger and more threatening to potential predators.
 Camouflage is a physiological change the Thorny Devil uses to help it survive. It will change its skin to a lighter colour in summer and a darker colour in colder months to help it cool or warm it.

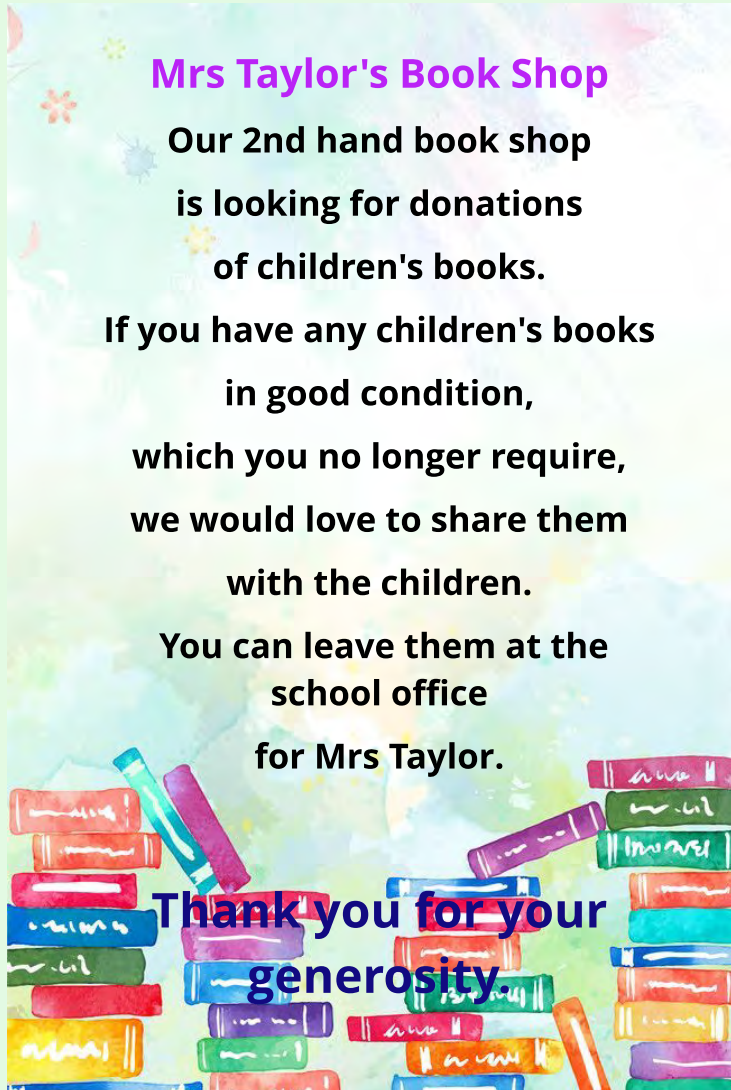

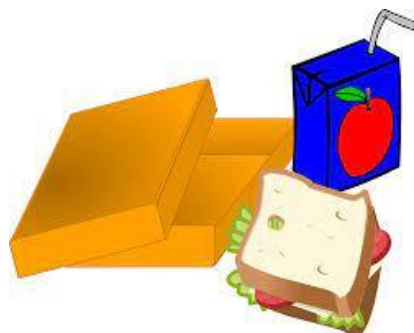
