

Important Updates

Lost Property

We understand it is inevitable that items will be misplaced by students from time to time. In the event that your child does lose something, they should:

- Visit the last area they remember having the item.
- Visit Lost Property which is located at the rear entrance of the administration block.

Students have access to Lost Property during the school day to search for misplaced possessions. Parents are able to access Lost Property before and after school hours.

To help us maintain Lost Property to a minimum level, we ask all parents to:

- Label all clothing and equipment with their child's full name.
- Check items regularly as labels do wear/wash off.
- Re-label items with the correct name if the item previously belonged to another sibling.

These simple measures will help your child to reclaim lost items. When possible, labelled items in Lost Property will be returned to students.

Lost Property that is not labelled will be held until Friday of week 9 (September 15th) this term. After this time, any lost property not claimed will be donated or disposed of.

We hope you find this information useful and thank you for your cooperation.

I wish to sincerely thank the teachers who will be attending this overnight excursion and their families. Our teachers are so generous with their time, and sacrifice family time to support the students on this excursion. We wish you safe travels, and I am sure you will build many memories with your peers.



In our Liturgy last week, we asked God to help us to continue the church's work in Spreading the Good News.











Caring for Others
















Our School


