Important Updates

Winter Beanies

With winter approaching, the school beanies will be available for sale for \$15.00 on the QKR app. Please note that these beanies are part of the school uniform, and are the only beanies that the students are permitted to wear at school.

PIVOT Programme

This programme allows every student to share their feelings and thoughts in several areas of school life. The students are surveyed every term, and feedback is given instantly to the teacher, helping raise awareness of any child needing additional support in developing a more positive attitude towards school life. The program also has a variety of quality resources which our teachers use as tools to develop the necessary skills the children require to be successful and maintain a positive outlook on learning and social interaction.

The Positivity Hub

Established in 2024, the Positivity Hub is geared towards working with children who require specific support to build a positive learning and social environment. The children involved visit the hub four times a day and meet with Mrs. McGowen, Mr. Bawden, and the school counsellors to develop goals for the school day. These goals are monitored throughout the day, and strategies are constructed with the child to help them navigate the day with increased independence, engagement, and success.

Social play groups during recess and lunch

Selected students are invited to join these groups in order to further develop their social skills. Social play groups are facilitated by our outstanding Teachers Aides. The students really enjoy the group play and have learned so much about teamwork, resilience, social interaction, and relationship building.

Library Passive Play

The library is open throughout the week for children who wish to read or enjoy a quieter break time. Many children use and enjoy the library space.

Protective Behaviours Programme

Each term, teachers build protective behaviour lessons into the learning cycle to empower all children to be proactive regarding their safety and wellbeing. This is important learning for our children to ensure they recognise unsafe situations and have strategies in place should they occur.

Cyber safety talks

Constable John Bollard visits the school each year to educate our students and parents on safe online behaviours. Constable Bollard will be joining us again next term to continue this important education for all families.

St. Andrew's identifies this area of student wellbeing as a very important part of school life. It is the responsibility of all community members to ensure that each child feels safe and has a positive attitude about school and themselves.

Stage Three Soccer Gala Day






The students helped to create this banner to show how they can share their love with others, like the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Six of our Faith in Action team members were able to go to the Parish to help sort out your generous donations.




