#### We begin our year celebrating the Eucharist

## From the office tenm Important Updates



Your child's birthday is a wonderful time to celebrate, and many of our students wish to share this experience with their classmates and peers. Students are welcome to celebrate their birthday at school.

We ask that you keep the following in mind:

- No homemade cakes are permitted.
- Food products containing nuts or chocolate are not permitted.
- Store bought individual items (e.g., mini cupcakes from Woolworths or Coles, Krispy Kreme donuts - plain variety). Iced cupcakes from Woolworths and Coles are permitted as they contain cocoa powder, and not chocolate.
- There can be no cakes/items that need to be cut prior to consumption.
- Food items must have an ingredients list visible. This is for health and safety reasons, and there will be no exceptions.

Food items must be delivered to the Administration office before 10:00am - they are **not** to be taken to the child's classroom.

We thank you for your understanding and for collaborating with us to keep all our students safe.

#### **Ash Wednesday**

On Ash Wednesday, the school came together again at Mass, to mark the beginning of Lent and our journey towards Easter. Fr Kevin Redmond spoke about the ways we can change in our thoughts, words and actions, to improve our relationships with God and others during this holy season. The ashes placed in the sign of the cross on our foreheads remind us that our focus in Lent is to become a friend of Jesus.

#### **Whole School Assembly**

On Friday, we gathered for our first whole school assembly in the school hall for the new year. We were so delighted to have many parents and friends join us. At this assembly we congratulated the children who received our St. Andrew's Awards for academic improvement and living our gospel teaching. Our next whole school assembly will be on Friday, March 8th at 2p.m. in the school hall. Please enter via the hall gate at the rear of the church car park.

#### **Change of day - Morning Assembly**

Each week, we gathered on Monday morning to celebrate the achievements of students who are recognised as student of the week in their class.

After careful consideration of our teaching and learning demands, morning assembly will now occur on Friday mornings instead. The format will be the same; the only change is the day. To transition to this new schedule, this Friday, February 16th, will be our first Friday morning assembly, where we will congratulate the students who have been nominated for student of the week for the upcoming week beginning February 19th.

#### Using the church drop off section in the morning

Just a reminder that the church drop-off point is only available for families to drop off their children in the mornings. Once on church grounds, we ask parents to wait in the queue and only allow the children to disembark the vehicle on the



passenger door side (church door side)when it is safe to do so. We ask our parents to remain in the vehicle and not overtake cars in the line. We have had many near misses in the past, so please be vigilant and aware of the children around the area.

#### Utilising every minute for learning time

This year our students will increase their mathematics learning time to 75 minutes a day. Our learning agenda and focus each year are based on our analytical breakdown of student results and goals. The learning framework that the children will experience begins with a warm-up activity to prepare the children for thinking mathematically, explicit teaching and modelling of skills and content from the teacher, followed by rich differentiated tasks so that children experience and develop competency with the skill and content. Following the independent tasks, teachers will reteach the concept using the explicit teaching model, clarifying misunderstandings and confusion, and finally, the students will have time to reflect. This reflection time enables students to identify what they did well and understood clearly, and what they will work on tomorrow. During each lesson, the teacher is noticing and tracking student growth and adjusting the learning for tomorrow. Our expectations are high, so every child has an opportunity to achieve learning success. We ask parents to ensure children are at school every day, except when they are ill. Every day your child is away is a missed opportunity to learn and flourish.

#### 3D printing on display

Our 3D printers are now located in the IT hub for children to view when in operation. This is a great way for children to experience the 3D printer in action. Thanks to Mr. Haynes for making this happen for the children.



#### New computer hardware

Every year, we have been building our bank of learning devices for children to use as part of their experiences at school. This year 70 new Chromebooks have been purchased. These will be distributed to classes in the coming weeks.

#### New sports jerseys for Gala Days

This year, with the great support of the P and F and sponsorship from OZ Fashions, we are able to purchase new school representative jerseys for the students. The teams will certainly look the part when they hit the field, representing our school in the different sporting events. I wish to thank all our parents for supporting our fundraising initiatives in 2023. The balance of the funds raised will be spent on new seating and picnic-style benches for students at the front of the school.

#### Strings Program for Years 3 and 4

All students in Years Three and Four experience a year of tuition on a string instrument. Students commenced their string tuition this week. This is a unique opportunity for all students to learn an instrument. This year we have been fortunate to be able to supplement our existing collection with \$50,000 worth of new instruments. The program allows the students to take home the instrument to further practise the skills at home. I wish to thank the CAPTIVATE Team from CSDP for their talent and dedication to our school.

#### **Library News**

All classes have a specific library day for borrowing library books (see below). Children can also borrow and return books before school and at lunchtime, provided they have their library bag with them.

Students in Year 1 to Year 6 have started borrowing.

Kindergarten will commence borrowing in Week 6 (Wednesday March 6).





















































#### **Caritas Project Compassion Launch 2024**

We arrived at St Finbar's Primary School and were led to a hall where two students from the hosting school led us in prayer and Acknowledgement Of Country. Then, many people, such as Bishop Vincent, gave speeches. Students had an opportunity to ask questions about the work of Caritas Australia through Project Compassion and what we, as students and as a school community, could do to help.

Next, we watched videos of the people who had been assisted by Caritas Australia, and their stories were inspiring. All had lived without some or any of their basic needs but had persisted in continuing on with their lives. With the help of Caritas Australia, they were able to get back on their feet. This got me thinking about more things that we could do to help people like them.

After this, we had many opportunities to ask questions, and then we shared what our school did and what our school could do in the future for Project Compassion. It was fun taking ideas from other schools and improvising them to make them suitable for our school.
