### **Important Reminders**

### **Absent notes**

The only legal document we have at school is the student attendance roll. It is important that the roll be accurate every day. The responsibility of parents is to inform the school when your child is absent and provide a reason for the absence. We have too many student absences currently without a note or reason for absence. I ask parents to please send a note to the class teacher on the day your child returns to school. Alternatively, parents can use the COMPASS app to provide a reason for the absence. I cannot stress enough the importance of this process. A letter will be sent home from teachers with dates of absences for parents to provide a reason. Please fill this in ASAP and return it to school. I thank you in advance for your attention to this matter.

### Smartwatches, phones, and cameras at school

Only children who have submitted an iPhone or smartwatch permission note are allowed to bring their devices to school, and they must be surrendered to the class teacher during the school day. This policy only applies to children in Years 3-6. Children who are infants are not permitted to bring these devices to school. The policy regarding this is on our website: 'Mobile phone and smartwatch policy'. At no time are children allowed to take photos while at school. We all need to be mindful of the privacy of our families. No cameras are permitted at school. I thank you in advance for supporting this policy.

iPhone or smartwatch permission notes are available from our school office.

### Car Park

Please do not park in the staff car park either in the morning or afternoon. It is too dangerous for cars to reverse out of the car park during peak drop-off and pick-up times. All parents are asked to find a safe, legal place to park and walk into the school grounds to collect the children in the afternoon. Alternatively, please use the morning drop-off service. The process for this is as follows:

Enter the church driveway and join the row of cars that are lined up under the church pergola.

When it is safe to do so, ask your child to exit the car on the passenger or church side. Please do not ask children to exit on the road side of the church.

Cars are not permitted to overtake the car in front. Please wait patiently until it is safe to move forward in the queue.

We ask that all parents display patience and exit when it is your turn to do so safely. When exiting the grounds, only turn left. A traffic holdup occurs when parents try to turn right.

Please remember that parents should not leave their vehicle at any time.

### Staff Outreach

Our staff regularly provides services to the community in many different ways. In the coming weeks, our staff will be making sandwiches for the St Vincent de Paul food van to provide a meal to some of our community members who are struggling to feed themselves. I wish to thank our staff for their generosity. Last week, the staff wrote Mother's Day cards and presented them to our local nursing home to distribute to the residents on Mother's Day. I am sure the residents were very pleased to be given a card on this special day.

This term, Kindergarten is learning more about God's love for us in the Unit: What Choices Make Love Grow?

This unit focuses on two main Sacred Scriptures:

- 1. Mark 12:28-34 The First Commandment
- 2. Mark 10: 46-52 The Healing of Blind Bartimaeus

Both Scriptures provide the students with a pathway of discovery to help them build their knowledge and understanding of God's love for us and what it means to be a person of faith.

<u>Driving Question:</u> How can we be a positive influence to help make love grow?

# Ignition activity, "A spot of love."

To launch the new learning for this inquiry unit, the students participated in a fun ignition task. The students listened to the story 'A Spot of Love', then responded to the question: What loving words or actions did you see in the story that helped love grow? Examples of loving words and actions from the story were recorded on a coloured spot and displayed in the classroom as individual love spots.







## Mark 10:46-52 The Healing of Blind Bartimaeus

Bartimaeus asked Jesus to restore his sight. Jesus healed him and said, "Your faith has made you well." Bartimaeus is an important character, as his response to Jesus' healing is an example for us to follow. On being cured, Bartimaeus immediately followed Jesus.

The students have enjoyed learning the Scripture story about Blind Bartimaeus and have demonstrated a good understanding of the sequence of events that led to the blind man being healed by Jesus.

# Community SPORTS NEWS





Lauren Griffiths (6 Green), who represented MacKillop at the NSW PSSA diving competition on Wednesday, May 15th.
