Important Updates

We understand that it is inevitable from time to time that items will be misplaced by students.

In order for an item which is found to be returned to the rightful owner, we ask that all items brought to school are labelled with the child's name and current class.

Items include: lunchboxes, drink bottles, jackets, jumpers, hats, library bags, wallets/purses.

If your child is bringing an item that previously belonged to another student, such as a sibling, please check and correct the label also.

The Lost Property area is located at the rear of the administration block. Students have access to Lost Property during the school day. Parents are welcome to search for items in Lost Property before and after school hours.

If you need to collect your child early from school, please send a note with your child to your child's teacher stating the time you wish to pick him or her up.

In the case of unforeseen circumstances, please come to the school office, and we will arrange for your child to be brought to the office for collection.

No child will be called to the office for collection during recess (11:00–11:30am) or lunch (1:30–2:00pm) without prior notice.

Any child leaving early must be signed out before 2:50pm.

If anyone other than the child's parent is collecting your child, please call the school office or send a letter to advise. Photo identification and a phone call to the parent for confirmation may be required; this includes emergency contacts.

The Administration team look forward to answering any inquiries you may have, or directing you to the appropriate staff member for help. Office hours are from 8:30am–3:30pm every day.

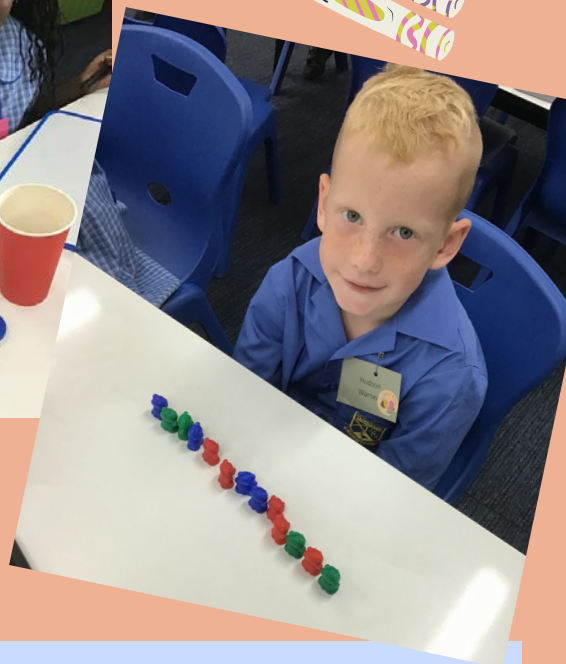
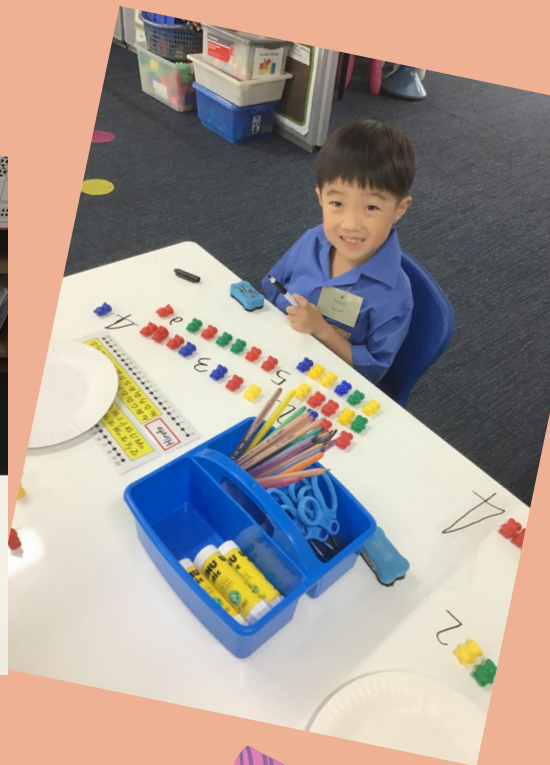
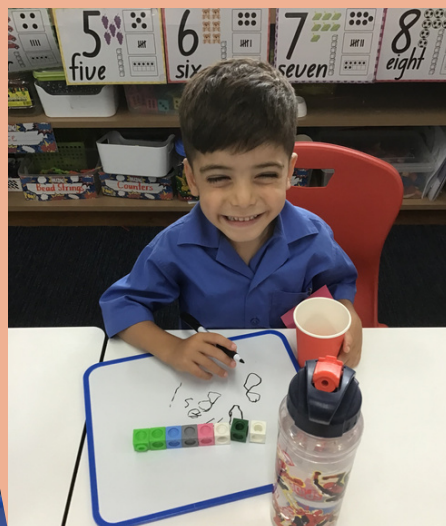

Term 1 School Holidays

I ask that you please think about commencing your holidays at the appropriate time and not early. Every day a student is away from school is time away from learning.

Whole School Assembly

Our first whole school assembly will be held on **Friday, February 16th at 2pm** in the school hall. At this assembly we congratulate the students who have achieved success academically as well as how they live their faith, showing the gospel teaching visibly to others. We look forward to seeing you there.

Dates for your diary- Opportunities to meet your child's teachers

During term 1, you will have two opportunities to meet with your child's teacher.

Firstly, a parent information night led by the grade teachers will be held on:

Monday, February 19th for Year 1 and 2 families

Tuesday, February 20th for Year 3 and 4 families

Wednesday, February 21st for Year 5 and 6 families.

Kindergarten families have already had an information night in 2023.

Also, parents will be invited to make an appointment with your child's teacher for a one to one interview. This interview is for parents who wish to discuss privately with the teacher any issues that may affect the learning and wellbeing of their child. I encourage parents to take up the opportunity to speak with the class teacher directly. A booking platform will be sent out in the coming weeks for parents to book a time.

School Safety and Wellbeing

As we commence the new school year, I wish to remind our community of some important school processes and policies to ensure that safety and wellbeing are our collective priorities.



1. Parents are asked not to park in the staff parking area. This car park is for **staff only**. Parents are asked to use the walkways and not walk through the car park, as reversing cars may result in a critical incident when competing with pedestrian traffic.
2. Please use the morning drop-off process correctly. Cars are to enter the parish gate and move slowly to the section under the church pergola. All children must disembark the vehicle from the church door side (car passenger side) and then walk directly into the school grounds. We ask that parents remain in the vehicle to ensure the line processes quickly and without delays. Delay when disembarking the vehicle may cause a bank up of traffic on Breakfast Road. Parents are not permitted to overtake vehicles once on church grounds. This is a high-risk manoeuvre that may cause a critical incident to occur.
3. Once children have entered the school grounds, they are not permitted to leave the gates. Please do not call your child back to the car or the street, as this will place your child at risk.
4. If you are late to school, parents must accompany the child to the front office and sign them in. A child is considered late once the morning music has finished. We ask that children arrive on time every day to ensure they have a very positive start to the school day.
5. Parents must conduct themselves at all times in a respectful manner. At no time, and for any reason should anger, violence or disrespect towards any staff member or community member be tolerated. All issues will be taken seriously and resolved in a respectful and timely way. The school reserves the right to report anti-social acts to the proper authorities.
6. Parking is the responsibility of every individual. If you park illegally and you receive a parking infringement, this is solely the responsibility of the driver. The school does not have any control or influence over the parking police that regularly patrol the streets around the school.
7. Please respect our neighbours and refrain from parking across their driveway. Our relationship with our neighbours is very important to us.
8. Parents are encouraged to communicate with the class teacher. If you wish to discuss an issue, please contact the school, requesting that the staff member contact you at their earliest convenience. Interviews with parents will not take place before the school day or during afternoon dismissal. The priority of every staff member at these times is the safety of every student.
9. If your child discloses a concern that has taken place during the school day, parents are encouraged to discuss the matter first with the class teacher. If they are aware of the issue, they may have already handled the situation. Class teachers are the first port of call for parents.

10. We ask parents not to use social media platforms to negatively disparage the school or any individual member, including students. This causes a breakdown in community building, and may also attract legal action. If you have issues or concerns, please contact the school directly so that the issue can be resolved respectfully and privately.
11. The school newsletter is released fortnightly on Wednesday. The first newsletter will be released on Wednesday, February 7th. The newsletter is the school's main information source, and we highly recommend that parents read it so they are informed as to what is happening in the life of the school. This is sent out through the Compass app.
12. Please download the COMPASS app onto your phone or device. All emails and correspondence will be sent via this platform. All student academic reports will also be accessed via this platform. Please contact the office if you are having trouble accessing COMPASS.

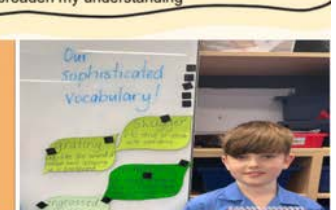

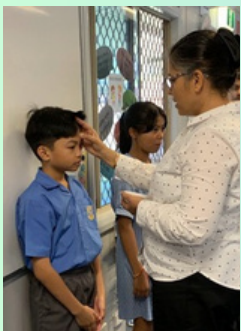
The Book of Samuel told us how Samuel anointed David and that

Community SPORTS NEWS



On 19 December 2023, William Ford represented St. Andrew's in the inaugural CSNSW Aquathlon, which involved a 100m swim and 1KM run done twice, with times being added together for the final results. William pushed through and placed 4th in his age group in the 1 kilometre runs, only seconds behind 3rd place.

On Saturday, William competed in his first swim meet of 2024 where he placed 1st in 50m freestyle, 2nd in 50m butterfly and 3rd in 50m breaststroke, 100m freestyle and 100m backstroke. William was presented with his medals by Paralympic swimmer Timothy Hodge.
