Your involvement as parents/carers is the key: together, we can be the change we want to see. Thank you again for being a champion for change in our world. We hope to see you on board again next year!







Driving question: How and why do we develop our relationship with God through prayer?










In Year 2, students have been learning about how we can build our relationship with God through prayer.
